Admissions Policy

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Applications for admissions to The Grammar Junior School

Applications for admissions to The Grammar Junior School for all classes must be submitted by June 15th for the following academic year. However, if there are available places, applications may be considered throughout the year.

Entrance assessments take place in November for Preschool and Class 1 and in March for Reception through Class 6.

Priority for admission will be given to siblings of children at the school if the candidates meet the criteria and have passed the entrance evaluation.

Application procedure

- Download and submit the online application form available on the school website to the school secretary.
- Parents will be contacted to schedule their child's entrance evaluation.

Submit the following documents:

1. A recent school report
2. Copy of the child's birth certificate
3. Medical report
4. Reference letter from the previous school including academic performance and personal conduct

Assessment Criteria

Reception and Pre-school

Individual assessments are conducted in friendly and relaxed setting, focusing on social and fine motor skills, sequencing, vocabulary, and readiness. Social skills will be assessed through team building exercises following the academic assessment. Candidates must complete the assessment within a specific time frame.

Classes 1, 2, 3

Individual or group assessments consist of an oral component followed by a written English or Greek and Mathematics test. Social skills will be assessed through team building exercises following the academic assessment. Candidates must complete the assessment within the time limit. Classes 1 and 2 assessments should take no longer than 30 minutes. Classes 3 should take no longer than one hour.

Classes 4, 5, 6

Entrance evaluations for Classes 4, 5 and 6 are conducted either individually or in a group. There is an oral assessment, followed by a written assessment in English and Mathematics. Candidates must complete the assessment within the time limit. Classes 4 should take no longer than one hour and Classes 5 and 6 no longer than 1 hour and 30 minutes. Social skills will be assessed through team building exercises following the academic assessment.

Acceptance procedure

- The Admissions Committee, including school staff and leadership reviews applications based on the set criteria.

- The parents of successful candidates are notified within five working days of the assessment and must confirm their child's place and register within two weeks.
- The school reserves the right to refuse entry to the school if the child has not passed the assessment, there is a poor report from a previous school or inappropriate behaviour during the assessment.
- In certain cases, candidates may be accepted conditionally and will be requested to attend extra lessons to enhance their Mathematics or English standard.

Reception and Pre-school

- Parents must specify any previous special education assessments or diagnosis from a child psychologist, educational psychologist, speech therapist, or occupational therapist.
- This information will help us tailor our resources and support systems to ensure your child's success.
- Please note that while the school strives to accommodate all learners, the capacity for specific support may vary. In rare cases, we may not be able to provide the necessary resources to meet a child's individual needs.
